Leveling Guidelines

Recreational (Beginner)

Please do not be fooled by this term. This player is considered to be able to overhead serve into a designated box, sustain a rally and keep score. These players are not necessarily "new to the sport", they are just newer to match play. This is not the division for those that have participated in tournaments or higher courts on school teams. (Rating 1.0 - 2.7, if rated)

Intermediate

This player will be more skilled and have more match play experience. Intermediate players must do all recreational players are able to do in addition to having more dependable strokes, being able to construct points, sustain longer rallies and strategize. These players have a better overall understanding of both singles and doubles. Tournament players and players that play on upper courts of school teams are better suited for this division. (Rating 2.8 - 3.4, if rated)
